During April I was able to attend the Annual meetings of the West Michigan and Kensington Valley Chapters, as well as Huron Valley's general membership meeting. I also participated in the grave marking ceremony of Patriot Charles Steward and marched in the Holland Memorial Parade with members of the DAR.
